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We began 2020 excited about continuing our programs at the Resource and Assessment Centre. During the first few months we helped facilitate donating equipment from the UK to the local hospital and to our children. We worked with a team from the UK to train our staff on how to make equipment for children with cerebral palsy and we continued with our speech and physical therapy programs. So much changed in March when restrictions were put in place by the Ghana Government due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Update - COVID-19

In March Kekeli's work was significantly altered because of the COVID-19 pandemic. All schools were closed, which meant that our Resource and Assessment Centre had to suspend our activities. This directly affected our families in many ways.

- Families used to go to the hospital for physical therapy and to see the dietician who treated the children for malnutrition. COVID-19 regulations mean they can no longer go to these classes.
- Since the new restrictions from COVID 19, many of our families have not been able to work. Some markets closed temporarily and the cost of food has gone up making it more difficult for our families to get the necessary food for their children.

As of June restrictions are slowly being lifted. Final year students in Senior High School and University level will resume classes this month. Kekeli will begin meeting with our children for individual Physical Therapy and Speech Therapy sessions. We are currently cleaning the centre and purchasing soap, hand sanitizer, bleach, and face masks to help protect our staff and families. Feeding Program and Water System

In response to the challenges our families are facing due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Kekeli started a GoFundMe campaign to raise \$3,000 to support feeding our children. Kekeli's Resource and Assessment Centre has faced challenges accessing water. Recently we received support from the Rotary Club of Nice, France to add a water tower and tanks to the centre to ensure we have water year round. We are extremely grateful for their support!

<u>Appropriate Paper-based Technology (APT)</u> <u>February - March</u>

In October 2019 four representatives from Kekeli attended a five day training in APT in Tamale, Ghana. APT is the science of using available, low cost, materials (paper and cardboard) to make something

useful. Products can include special chairs for children with disabilities as well as a wide range of therapy resources.

This year we welcomed a five member team from UK to train Kekeli staff, Physical Therapists and Speech Therapists from the Ho Teaching Hospital on APT. In two weeks we were able to make two special chairs and two standing devices for Kekeli's children. Our staff are now trained on measuring children for devices and making specialized equipment. We also have a space at the Resource and Assessment Centre for making devices for our children.

PhysioNet - February

In October 2019 PhysioNet with support of the Rotary Club of Norwich, England shipped a 40 foot container of physical therapy equipment for Kekeli's Resource and Assessment Centre. It was cleared at the port and sent to Ho for distribution to our families, the Centre and to the Ho Teaching Hospital. This equipment will enable all our children to have specialized equipment when they visit the centre and at their homes. The equipment at the hospital will improve the services for our children at the physical therapy unit. We look forward to an upcoming online training on how to use the equipment from PhysioNet that will further help the specialists and the families.
